1	The trainee works in an established general paediatric service.			
2	The trainee works closely with the consultant team providing a broad range of services for patients and their families both within and outside the hospital setting. The trainee has a significant role within the team including the opportunity to take a level of responsibility under supervision appropriate to their experience and skill set. The experience will continuously extend them professionally. The trainee is part of the RMO paediatric after hours on call roster and works under appropriate consultant supervision.			
3	The trainee has an opportunity to review / reflect on previous training and adapt this attachment to <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Allow for different levels of responsibility and supervision as appropriate b. Consolidate areas of clinical practice in preparation for functioning as an independent general paediatrician with achievement of individual long term goals. 			
4	The trainee assumes case responsibility (with relevant consultant supervision) following patients through for the length of the attachment – becoming comfortable with continuity of care, through to resolution or to the end of the trainee attachment.			
5	The trainee has the opportunity to interface with tertiary paediatric specialists			

6	The trainee is advised of the run sufficiently in advance of the starting date in order that prospective approval can be obtained from the College.			
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7	The trainee will have opportunity for teaching and supervision of nurses, trainee interns and less experienced RMO's			
8	The trainee should gain experience providing ongoing care for children and young people with complex medical problems using a collaborative approach with supervision from onsite general paediatricians and where relevant support from subspecialist paediatric services			
9	The trainee must have one half day of their week to work on non-clinical activities such as their advanced training project.			
10	The trainee should conduct a minimum of two outpatient sessions per week, including newly referred patients, on top of inpatients, averaged out over the 6 months of the general paediatric metropolitan requirement, with their own consulting space. The trainee will be supervised by an easily accessible consultant paediatrician, with opportunity to discuss the patient both before and after the consultation. Assessment and management of a wide range of systems disorders is an important experience.			



11	At least two general paediatricians will be available to supervise the trainee. These RACP trained supervisors will assist the trainee in identifying their training goals and developing a learning programme			
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
