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1. INTRODUCTION

These Terms of Reference are to be read in conjunction with the Governance of College Bodies By-law. Both the Governance of College Bodies By-law and these Terms of Reference govern the College Body.

1.1. Established

The Faculty Training Committee – Public Health Medicine is established under the authority of the Australasian Faculty of Public Health Medicine (AFPHM) Education Committee to perform the Functions set out in these Terms of Reference and all matters ancillary to those functions.

1.2. Term

Members of the Committee shall be appointed in accordance with the process for the appointment of members to College Bodies as set out in the Governance of College Bodies By-law or any by-law or document that replaces or complements that By-law from time to time.

The term of membership for nominated positions to the committee shall be three years and members are eligible for, but not entitled to, re-appointment for a further 3-year term up to a maximum of two (2) three-year terms of continuous appointment.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of Faculty Training Committee – Public Health Medicine is to provide advice and support to the AFPHM Education Committee (FEC) on teaching and learning matters relevant to public health medicine trainees, and oversee regional processes for recruitment, training, career development and support of public health medicine trainees.

3. FUNCTIONS

The functions of the Faculty Training Committee – Public Health Medicine are:

- a) assess eligibility and commencement of training;
- b) monitor and assess the progress of individual trainees in Public Health Medicine;
- c) assess recognition of prior learning (RPL);
- d) monitor and review training program requirements and curricula in Public Health Medicine in consultation with relevant stakeholders and recommend changes to the AFPHM Education Committee;
- e) oversee and review the training program at a regional level in consultation with stakeholders recommending changes, as appropriate;
- f) modify training requirements for individual trainees, as appropriate, in accordance with College policies and procedures, and
- g) advise on recruitment, support and development for trainees.

The Committee must not:

- a) enter into contractual relationships;
- b) represent or imply in any way that the committee is a body independent of the College;
- c) form education policy independent of the College Education Committee.

4. MEMBER COMPOSITION

The Membership of the College Body shall comprise up to twelve (12) members selected by expressions of interest. Members may have multiple responsibilities.

4.1. Ex-officio Members

- a Chair appointed by the Faculty Education Committee

4.2. Appointed Members

[Members appointed via an Expression of Interest process]

Up to 11 appointed members comprising:

- an elected Deputy Chair;
- a member who is allocated responsibility for New Zealand interests;
- up to two advanced trainees in Public Health Medicine

4.3. Co-opted members

Co-opted members may be appointed for a particular purpose or term.

5. MEETING

This section is to be read in conjunction with the Governance of College Bodies By-law.

5.1. Number of Meetings

The College Body shall hold a minimum of four (4) meetings per calendar year and shall meet by teleconference, face to face (twice annually) and/or videoconference. Additional meetings require approval from the Chair of the Faculty Education Committee and the Executive General Manager, Education, Learning and Assessment.

5.2. Chair

The Chair or their appointee will Chair all meetings.

5.3. Quorum

A quorum is one half of the total College Body membership.

5.4. Voting

Decisions will be made by consensus of the majority of members.

5.5. Secretariat

Meeting agenda, supporting papers and minutes or outcomes will be provided prior to the date of the meeting.

6. REPORTING

The College Body must report and make recommendations to the AFPHM Education Committee as required.

The College Body is required to provide to the Parent Body each year:

- a new or updated Work Plan (Work Plans may be one or two years)
- a report against the preceding years' Work Plan.
