By-law

BY-LAW PURSUANT TO THE CONSITUTION OF THE ROYAL AUSTRALASIAN COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT AND OPERATION OF A COLLEGE BODY

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1. INTRODUCTION

The Board of The Royal Australasian College of Physicians has established the Paediatrics & Child Health Division (the "College Body"). The <u>Governance of College Bodies By-law</u> sets out the general provisions for governance of College Bodies. Both the Governance of College Bodies By-law and this By-law govern the College Body.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this College Body is to be the College's peak body representing the interests of Fellows and trainees of the Paediatrics & Child Health Division.

3. FUNCTIONS

The functions of the Paediatrics & Child Health Division include:

- a) support the professional careers of Fellows and Trainees of the Division;
- b) work with other relevant appropriate College Bodies and staff in relation to:
 - i. education, training and assessment of trainees;
 - ii. education, continuing professional development and quality performance of Fellows;
 - iii. policy and advocacy;
 - iv. the assessment of overseas trained professionals;
 - v. research; and
 - vi. workforce.
 - vii. as each relates to paediatrics and child health;
- promote and advance the body of knowledge and the quality and safe practice of paediatrics and child health;
- d) act as the authoritative source of direction and advice within the College in regards to paediatrics and child health;
- e) act as the authoritative voice of the College externally in regards to paediatrics and child health particularly in the areas of policy and advocacy; and
- f) provide governance and oversight for other paediatrics and child health bodies of the College, including the Division Education Committee, Division Policy and Advocacy Committee, Division Research Committee and Chapter of Community Child Health;
- g) determine re-admission to Fellowship applications submitted to them.

4. COLLEGE BODY PROHIBITIONS

The Paediatrics & Child Health Division must not:

- enter into any agreement binding upon it or on the College; or
- represent or imply in any way that the College Body is a body independent of the College.

5. MEMBER COMPOSITION

The Membership of the Paediatrics & Child Health Division shall comprise up to 19 members, comprising:

5.1. Ex-officio Members

Nine ex-officio members comprising:

- Chair, Aotearoa New Zealand Paediatrics & Child Health Division Committee;
- Chair, Paediatric Policy and Advocacy Committee
- Chair, Paediatric Research Committee;
- Chair, PCHD Education Committee
- Chair, Chapter of Community Child Health;
- Chair (or delegated member) of the Adolescent and Young Adult Medicine Committee (being a paediatrician) who is not otherwise a member of the Council of the Division;
- A Fellow of the Continuing Professional Development Committee, nominated by that committee, who is not otherwise a member of the Council of the Division; and
- Two trainee representatives, nominated by the College Trainee's Committee

5.2. Appointed Members

Up to eight appointed members comprising:

- Six Fellows of the Division resident in Australia
- Two Fellows of the Division resident in Aotearoa New Zealand

5.3. Elected Members

Up to two elected members, elected by the Members of the Division, including:

- President of the Division
- President-elect of the Division

6. MEETING

This section is to be read in conjunction with the Governance of College Bodies By-law.

6.1. Number of Meetings

The Paediatrics & Child Health Division shall hold a minimum of two meetings per calendar year and shall meet by teleconference, face to face or videoconference.

6.2. Chair

The Chair or their appointee will Chair all meetings.

6.3. Quorum

A quorum is one half of the total College Body membership.

6.4. Voting

Decisions will be made by consensus of the majority of members.

6.5. Minutes

The proceedings of all meetings of the Paediatrics & Child Health Division shall be recorded in the minutes.

6.6. Secretariat

Meeting agenda, supporting papers and minutes or outcomes will be provided prior to the date of the meeting.

6.7. College Body Reviews

The Paediatrics & Child Health Division is to undertake a skill and experience review annually.

The Paediatrics & Child Health Division is to review their performance against this By-law every two years.

7. REPORTING

The Paediatrics & Child Health Division must report and make recommendations to the Board as required.

The Paediatrics & Child Health Division is required to provide to the Board each year:

- a new or updated work plan (work plans may be one or two years)
- a report against the preceding years' work plan.

8. REVIEW OF BY-LAWS

These By-laws will be reviewed each three years.

Trainee	Has the same meaning as in the College Constitution
