The following communiqué highlights the key issues and activities of the Chapter of Community Child Health Committee (CCCHC) for the second half of 2017.

KEY ACTIVITIES

Chapter Satellite Day

The 2018 Chapter Satellite Day will be held in Sydney, once again in collaboration with the Neurodevelopmental and Behavioural Paediatric Society of Australasia (NBPSA) Education Day over the weekend of 12-13 May 2018. This has followed a successful collaboration in Melbourne this year where the feedback from attendees was very positive.

The CCCHC has established a Chapter Satellite Day working group (consisting of Dr Brad Jongeling, Dr Chris Ward and Dr Natalie Ong) and I would like to thank the group for their ongoing commitment to developing the program for next year. Full details, including links to registration, will follow shortly. The theme for the weekend will centre around psychopharmacology.

Policy and Advocacy

The CCCHC have contributed to and provided their expert feedback on a range of submissions and consultations which include:

- RACP submission to the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) Costs, Productivity Commission Position Paper, July 2017
- RACP submission to the Inquiry into the provision of services under the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) Early Childhood Early Intervention (ECEI) approach, August 2017
- RACP submission to the diagnostic process for children, adolescents, and adults referred for assessment of autism spectrum disorder in Australia: National guideline, November 2017.

Evolve

Evolve is the RACP's initiative to reduce clinical practices that are sometimes overused and not supported by current evidence. <u>Evolve</u> aims to drive high-value, evidence-based, and safe care to improve patient health outcomes.

The CCCH Evolve working group (consisting of Dr Lakshman Doddamani, Dr Deepa Jeyaseelan and Dr Brad Jongeling) are working to identify recommendations relating to low-value clinical practices relevant to community child health paediatricians. I would like to thank the group for their expertise and progress made to date. Further details regarding the community child health evolve list will be communicated in 2018.
