Research in Education

- The PRC continues to support work undertaken by the College, such as the basic training curriculum review and the activity reviewing research project requirements, to ensure that trainees standard of research is high.
- The [RACP Research Projects e-Learning resource](#) is now available. This online resource is a self-directed resource covering the process of conducting RACP research projects. The resource includes interviews with six trainees, exploring their journey completing one of the acceptable types of RACP research projects: Research in human subjects, populations and communities or laboratory research; Audit; and Systematic review.

The paediatric component of the College Congress in May was well received with topics including:

- [PCHD International Grant: Asia Pacific](#)
Some of you may remember the former Asia-Pacific Pediatric Association (APPA) Travelling Scholarship (last awarded in 2009) - this new grant ensures that opportunity to gain experience in Australia or New Zealand continues for our close neighbours.

This is a fantastic opportunity for a Fellow of the Division to sponsor an international medical graduate or specialist to further their knowledge in medical education or research in the field of paediatrics. Alternatively, the grant may be used to provide a medical education program for international medical graduates or specialists in the Asia-Pacific with support from a Fellow - however there are parameters around this including direct benefit to the region.

Each year \$10,000 will be made available.

Applications for the Grant are now open.

The Scholarship is valued at up to \$40,000, providing a funded pathway related to Paediatrics & Child Health training over three to four years. This includes\

 - RACP training fees
 - Examination fees
 - Attendance at College Congress (or relevant Annual Scientific Meeting) each year
 - \$2,500 cash assistance at beginning of Scholarship.

2017 applications open 1 October 2016 and close on 30 November 2016

- [RACP PCHD NHMRC Award for Excellence](#)
This Award was established in 2014 with to support the top young paediatric clinical researchers as part of a shared commitment to nurture the next generation of medical researchers. The PCHD recipient receives additional 'top up' funds from, the RACP Foundation, to the [Australian] National Health & Medical Research Council [NHMRC] Postgraduate Scholarship, for up to three years. To be considered, applicants must tick the appropriate check box on the NHMRC form.



Recipients for the 2017 award will be assessed in a few weeks. The 2018 award applications will open in May 2017.
