KEY ACTIVITIES

The PRC have collaborated with several other PCHD Committees during 2017 to focus on priority areas such as policy, education and of course research. Some of our key activities are highlighted below.

- The PRC appointed Prof David Isaacs as the Journal of Paediatrics and Child Health (JPCH) representative in February 2017.
- The PRC Chair dialled in to a Paediatrics & Child Health Division Policy & Advocacy Committee (PPAC) meeting in March 2017 to discuss the PRC as a resource for PPAC work, the research toolkit, and methodology for identifying priority topics.
- Dr Margie Danchin, Australian Paediatric Research Network (APRN) representative on the PRC, attended the Australian Research Alliance for Children and Youth Annual General Meeting in May 2017.
- The PRC appointed A/Prof Paul Fullerton as the PCHD Education Committee (PDEC) representative in July 2017.
- The PRC provided advice to the PDEC and PPAC on advanced training research projects, in relation to trainee work on position statement development.
- The PRC Chair contributed to a <u>Letter to the JPCH Editor</u> on the RACP Evolve General Paediatric List, published in September.
- Model of Collaboration agreements are being drafted with the APRN and the Australian Paediatric Surveillance Unit.
- The PRC are developing a communication to ensure research career pathways for paediatricians are easily recognised. Further information on "Articulating Academic Pathways for Future Fellows" will follow next year.
- The PRC have contributed to the PCHD Council's work on the Division's identity and purpose through providing a research perspective.
- I would personally like to thank Dr Carla Morley, trainee representative on the PRC, for her article on trainee research projects which was published in the November e-Bulletin.
