

Sir/ I have to report in connection with the above that hereunder is a list of half-blood aboriginals residing in this Division, whose children are entitled to child endowment.

BAYLES?Edna Violet.a female, born on 22nd.March, 1933. BAYLES, Clare Phoebe, a female, born on 17th.May, 1939.

Bayles receives constant employsest in the Eidsvold District and his wife resides in Eidsvold. She is capable of utilising the endowment she receives on behalf of her children to their benefit.She lives in a small house which is owned by her husband about a mile from the township.

CHAPMAN, Jumes. Half-blood aboriginal.

Saltmer is in constant employment around the District and his wife resides in her own house on the cutskirts of the township, she is receiving child endowment for her family and is capable of utilising it to their benefit.

SMITH, Roy. SMITH, Daisy. SMITH, Daisy. SMITH, Gwen, a female, born on the 15th. December, 1925. SMITH, Mervyn, a male, born on the 16th. August, 1926. SMITH, Maurice, a male, born on the 16th. Hebruary, 1928. SMITH, Vulma, a female, born on the 17th. July, 1933

Smith is employed by Martin Snelling & Co., as a station hand on a property at Hollywell, Via Eidsvold. He lives in a house on the property with his family. His wife is receiving the child endowment for her children and is an intelligent person and capable of utilising the endowment to the benefit of her children.
