South Hobart

**Perfect for: walkers, history lovers, beer enthusiasts,
and anyone wanting to experience Hobart's natural beauty**

South Hobart is one of the city's most picturesque suburbs, nestled beneath kunanyi / Mount Wellington.

Start your day with breakfast at one of South Hobart's excellent local cafés: Bear with me or Ginger Brown.

From here, you can enjoy a leisurely walk along the Hobart Rivulet Track, passing beautiful gardens, native vegetation, and views up toward the mountain.

If you're lucky, you may even spot a platypus in the rivulet — something locals occasionally encounter, particularly near Cascade Brewery.

Popular with...

History lovers

Visit the **Cascades Female Factory**, a UNESCO World Heritage-listed site that tells the story of the convict women and girls who were transported to Van Diemen's Land. It's one of Australia's most important historical sites and offers a powerful insight into Tasmania's colonial past.



Beer lovers

Take a tour of **Cascade Brewery**, Australia's oldest operating brewery. Enjoy a brewery tour, a tasting paddle, and lunch in the beautiful heritage gardens beneath kunanyi.

Walkers and hikers

South Hobart is the gateway to some wonderful bushwalks:

- **Myrtle Gully Track:** a lush forest walk through towering ferns leading to Myrtle Gully Falls
- **Silver Falls Walk:** a popular and accessible waterfall walk through temperate rainforest
- **O'Grady's Falls:** a peaceful and less-travelled waterfall trail

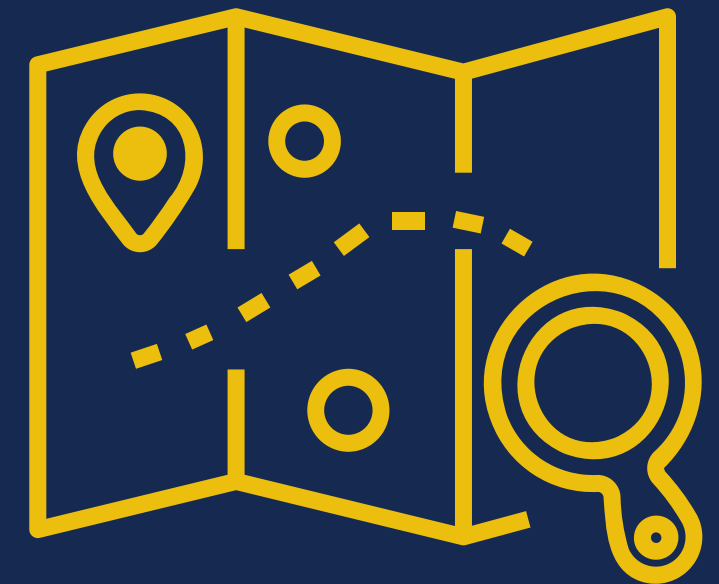


Adventure awaits

If you'd prefer spectacular views without a long hike, it's only a 15 to 20-minute drive to the summit of kunanyi / Mount Wellington, where you'll be rewarded with panoramic views across Hobart, the Derwent River and beyond.

Recommended walks from the summit area:

- **Sphinx Rock Track** (short walk with exceptional views)
- **Silver Falls Loop** (easy forest walk)
- **Pipeline Track** (longer walk)



Richmond and the Coal River Valley

Perfect for: wine lovers, foodies, history enthusiasts, and anyone looking for a relaxed day trip

Just 20 minutes from Hobart, the Coal River Valley combines award-winning wineries with one of Australia's most charming historic towns.

Begin your morning in Richmond, a beautifully preserved Georgian village. Enjoy breakfast at one of the local cafés before exploring:

- Richmond Bridge: Australia's oldest surviving stone bridge
- Historic sandstone buildings and churches
- Antique and gift shops along the main street
- The resident ducks and riverside walking paths

After exploring Richmond, spend the afternoon sampling some of Tasmania's finest cool-climate wines.

MONA

Perfect for: art lovers, the curious, foodies, and anyone who enjoys the unexpected

The Museum of Old and New Art (MONA) is unlike any museum you've visited before. Built into the sandstone cliffs overlooking the Derwent River, MONA houses the private collection of businessman and philanthropist David Walsh and has become one of Australia's most talked-about cultural attractions.

- **Take the MONA Ferry:** Start by boarding the ferry from Brooke Street Pier. The ferry journey itself is part of the experience, offering beautiful views of the River Derwent and Hobart's waterfront.
- **Explore MONA:** Allow several hours to wander through the museum's fascinating, provocative, and often surprising galleries.
- **Visit Moorilla Estate:** MONA sits within Moorilla Estate, one of Tasmania's oldest vineyards. Enjoy a tasting at the cellar door and take in the vineyard views.

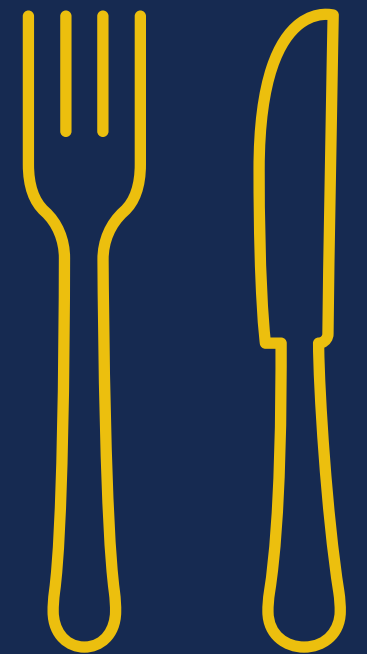

- **The MONA Lawns:** For something more relaxed, grab a bottle of local wine, some casual dining options, and enjoy the sunshine, live music, and bean bags overlooking the river



Battery Point



Perfect for: photographers, history enthusiasts, and leisurely explorers

Take a short walk up Kelly's Steps, built in 1839 by whaling captain James Kelly, linking the waterfront with one of Hobart's oldest neighbourhoods.

As you wander Battery Point, be sure to visit:

- **Arthur Circus:** A beautifully preserved collection of colonial cottages arranged around a small village green. It's one of Hobart's most photographed locations.
- **Battery Point Sculpture Trail:** A scenic walking trail that weaves through historic streets and waterfront areas, combining local history with public art.
- **Hampden Road:** The heart of Battery Point, lined with boutique shops, bakeries, wine bars, galleries and cafés. It's the perfect place to stop for coffee, lunch, or an afternoon glass of Tasmanian wine.

Whether you're after excellent coffee, a leisurely brunch, or a classic Hobart bakery experience, these are some of the favourite breakfast spots around town.

- **Born in Brunswick**: A stylish local favourite known for great coffee and creative brunch dishes
- **Bear With Me**: Tucked away in South Hobart, this welcoming café is renowned for its quality coffee and relaxed atmosphere
- **Room For A Pony**: A lively neighbourhood café offering excellent coffee, brunch and all-day dining in a beautiful heritage setting
- **Daci & Daci Bakers**: An Hobart institution serving exceptional pastries, cakes and breakfast options in a beautiful European-style setting
- **Jackman & McRoss**: Located in historic Battery Point, this beloved bakery is famous for its pastries, pies and charming local atmosphere
