What is this study about?

People with intellectual disability can have poor health. This might not have happened if they could easily use preventive health care. Preventive health care is a type of health care. Preventive health care are things that support people to stay healthy and get better quickly when they are sick or are injured. This project wants to make it easy for people with intellectual disability to engage in health action planning with their doctor to take care of their preventive health. Health action planning is when you make a plan with a doctor about things you can do to take care of your health (e.g., dietary changes, specialist referrals, screening procedures, blood tests).

Through our partnership with key groups, this study will communicate with people with intellectual disability, their support networks (paid and non-paid) and health professionals to improve health action planning for people with intellectual disability. We want to learn from the experiences of health care professionals who have provided preventive health care to people with intellectual disability.

Who can participate?

You can take part in this study if you:

- i) Are 18 years of age or older
- ii) Live and have worked in Australia
- iii) Have experience providing preventive health care to people with intellectual disability in Australia

What will it involve?

Your participation will involve talking to a member of the research team face to face or via the telephone, video conferencing or email. This may involve attending an interview or focus group that will take between 1-2 hours. You will receive a \$50 gift card for your participation.

What will this information be used for?

Your experiences will be used to help us design a new way of doing accessible and collaborative health action planning.
