

Core Training in **Haematology** can only be undertaken in an accredited training setting.
Applicants are advised that the position applied for must be appropriate within these settings for Core Training to be approved.

All Core Clinical Haematology training sites in New Zealand are accredited by the Aotearoa New Zealand Joint College Training Subcommittee in Haematology /The Royal Australian College of Physicians (RACP).

All Laboratory training sites are accredited by the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia (RCPA).

Trainees must train at a minimum of 2 different settings with a maximum of 36 months' training at any setting.

Laboratory Training

Laboratory training is accredited by the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia (RCPA) and the RCPA must be contacted directly for any laboratory accreditation queries.

[The RCPA Laboratory Site Accreditation List](#) should be consulted for the accreditation status of core laboratory training positions.

A maximum of 6 months training may be approved in any NZ blood service.

Overseas Training Sites

Trainees applying for overseas training must submit evidence related to supervision and training to ensure the placement is relevant to gain competencies required by the curriculum. Core training will only be certified in places where the training experience is similar to that of Australia or New Zealand.

Applications for overseas training must be submitted at least six months in advance. To support the application the following information must be submitted:

- Two supervisors (approved by Committee).
- Position description and roster.
- Evidence that the site is accredited for Haematology training.
- Detailed information on the training experience, education program and relevance of training.
