

# Australasian Chapter of Addiction Medicine Committee By-law

## BY-LAW PURSUANT TO THE CONSITUTION OF THE ROYAL AUSTRALASIAN COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT AND OPERATION OF BOARD COMMITTEES

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## **1. INTRODUCTION**

The Board of the Royal Australasian College of Physicians has established the Australasian Chapter of Addiction Medicine Committee (the “College Body”). The Governance of College Bodies By-law sets out the general provisions for governance of College Bodies. Both the Governance of College Bodies By-law and this By-law govern the College Body.

## **2. PURPOSE**

The purpose of the College Body is to act as the peak decision-making body for the Australasian Chapter of Addiction Medicine.

## **3. FUNCTIONS**

The functions of the College Body include:

- a) supporting the professional careers of Fellows and trainees of the Chapter;
- b) working with other relevant appropriate College Bodies and staff in relation to:
  - i. education, training and assessment of trainees;
  - ii. education, continuing professional development and quality performance of Fellows;
  - iii. policy and advocacy;
  - iv. the assessment of overseas trained professionals;
  - v. research; and
  - vi. workforce,as each relates to addiction medicine;
- c) promoting and advancing the body of knowledge of addiction medicine; and
- d) acting as an authoritative source of advice within the College with regard to addiction medicine.

## **4. COMMITTEE PROHIBITIONS**

The College Body must not:

- a) Enter into any agreement binding upon it or on the College; or
- b) Represent or imply in any way that the College Body is a body independent of the College.

## **5. MEMBER COMPOSITION**

The Membership of the Committee shall comprise up to 11 members.

### **1.1. Elected Members**

Up to nine elected members, elected by the Members of the Australasian Chapter of Addiction Medicine.

### **5.1. Ex-officio Members**

No ex-officio members listed.

### **5.2. Appointed Members:**

Up to one appointed member comprising:

- a) A representative of The Australasian Professional Society on Alcohol & other Drugs (APSAD). The holder of this position must be:
  - i. a Fellow of the Australasian Chapter of Addiction Medicine (FACHAM); and
  - ii. the President, President-elect or Vice President of the APSAD, or any other officeholder of the APSAD approved by the Chapter Committee.

- b) Chair of the Training Committee in Addiction Medicine (TCAM) appointed by TCAM.

### **5.3. Elected Members**

- a) the President of the Chapter (to Chair)
- b) the President-elect of the Chapter
- c) one Fellow of the Chapter from Aotearoa New Zealand Branch Convenor
- d) one Fellow of the Chapter from each of the following Australian branches (to be referred to as the Branch Lead Convenor):
  - i. Queensland
  - ii. New South Wales/Australian Capital Territory
  - iii. Victoria/Tasmania
  - iv. South Australia/Northern Territory
  - v. Western Australia
- e) one trainee of the Chapter elected by trainees.

### **5.4. Independent Community Members**

No independent Community Members listed.

### **5.5. Co-opted members**

Co-opted members may be appointed for a particular purpose or term.

## **6. MEETING**

This section is to be read in conjunction with the Governance of College Bodies By-law.

### **6.1. Number of Meetings**

The College Body shall hold a minimum of four meetings per calendar year and shall meet by teleconference, face to face or videoconference.

### **6.2. Chair**

The Chair or their appointee will Chair all meetings.

### **6.3. Quorum**

A quorum is one half of the total College Body membership.

### **6.4. Voting**

Decisions will be made by consensus of the majority of members.

### **6.5. Minutes**

The proceedings of all meetings of the Committee shall be recorded in the minutes.

### **6.6. Secretariat**

Meeting agenda, supporting papers and minutes or outcomes will be provided prior to the date of the meeting.

### **6.7. Committee/Council Reviews**

The Committee are to undertake a skill and experience review annually.  
The Committee are to review their performance against this By-law every two years.

## **7. REPORTING**

- a) The College Body must report and make recommendations to the Adult Medicine Division Council as required.

- b) The College Body is required to provide to the Adult Medicine Division Council each year:
- i. a new or updated work plan (work plans may be one or two years)
  - ii. a report against the preceding years' work plan.

## 8. A REPORT AGAINST THE PRECEDING YEARS' WORK PLAN REVIEW OF BY-LAW

This By-law will be reviewed every three years.

Parent Body	Has the same meaning as the Governance of College Bodies By-law
Trainee	Has the same meaning as in the College Constitution.
